Dear Parent(s) & Guardian(s),

The Eclipse team will be taking a field trip on October 8. The team will be traveling to Manhattan, KS, for a 2.7 mile hike on the scenic Konza Prairie, located within the Flint Hills. The education program is focused on topics of: plant and animal diversity of the prairie, prairie ecology, geology of the Flint Hills and local history of settlers. We will be leaving from WRMS at 8:30 am and returning at 2:30 pm. If students are not at school by 8:30 am, they will not be able to attend.

We will be hiking during the entirety of the fieldtrip. It is mandatory that students wear tennis shoes/hiking boots, pants and a jacket! Absolutely no sandals or flip flops. Failure to wear appropriate clothing will result in not being able to attend the fieldtrip. We also advise students to bring gloves, hats or ear warmers as the wind is quite fierce on the prairie. If your child has asthma, please have them bring their inhalers.

There is no drinking water available on the trail, so if students want to bring a bottle of water to drink they may. We will also be eating lunch after the hike. Students may have a sack lunch prepared by the school, or they may bring a sack lunch from home. Lunches prepared by school consist of a type of sandwich, vegetable, fruit, cookie and milk. Please indicate at the bottom of this letter if your student will be eating a prepared lunch or bringing their own.

We look forward to an exciting trip to the Konza Prairie. Please send your student to school with the bottom of this sheet filled out by September 24.
